



# Community Building Tutors

## High School Students

CBT offers opportunities for high-school students to give back to their community and earn valuable experience. Volunteering for CBT can also count as service learning hours for your school. Students don't have to have any prior tutoring experience to get involved, but a desire to work with younger children is a must. Many of the roles open to students can provide excellent hands on experience for an aspiring teacher; however, all students are eligible for the following roles regardless of their future career goals. A desire to work with young learners and give back to the community is what's important!



**Tutor:** Strengthen your community by tutoring young learners, ages four through twelve, once or twice a week at one of CBT's sites. Tutors work one-on-one and in small groups with young learners to help them improve academically. Our tutoring sessions are formatted so that students spend time on both academic work and in a wide variety of activities that help to build a young learners sense of community and civic engagement.

**Community Building Event Volunteer:** Participate in one of CBT's Community Building Events. Events focus on strengthening the community and involve tutors, professionals, young learners, and volunteers. Events can range from beautifying a public space by picking up debris and planting flowers to volunteering at an animal shelter.
