Do you, like us, think it is important to dedicate some of your time and energy to promote education and community involvement? Activity Leader: Share a specific skill with CBT's young learners one time or once a month. An activity example is teaching the young learners and tutors how to play chess, build a kite or how to knit. Your imagination is your only limit! Activities should be an engaging 30-45 minutes long and will take place once tutoring has ended.

Community Building Event Volunteer: Attend and/or help plan one of CBT's Community Building Events. Events focus on strengthening the community and involve tutors, professionals, young learners, and volunteers. Events can range from beautifying a public space by picking up debris and planting flowers or volunteering at an animal shelter.

Board Member: Attend quarterly board meetings and assist in the growth and development of CBT. Your role as a board member can be tailored to your interests and areas of expertise. Areas you can contribute to are: volunteer recruitment, development, event planning, education development, finance, and marketing.
